Metro Detroit Needs Reliable Transit

Southeast Michigan desperately needs quality transportation options, and it is time to get serious about making this happen.

Transit does something simple: It connects people with their places of employment, the schools they attend, entertainment venues they enjoy, and to each other. In 2012, we no longer both live and work in the same community, and in southeast Michigan, a growing segment of the population that uses the available public transit is reliant upon current options. Studies show that approximately 65 percent of SMART bus users utilize the service to get to and from work, and nearly 1 million people use SMART (Suburban Mobility Authority for Regional Transportation) buses to travel to work, school, doctor's offices and shopping centers annually.

As a group of city and county legislators working across geographic boundaries, *Regional Partners Advocating Transit Here* recognizes that the need for access to reliable transportation affects us all. It is *R-PATH's* goal to engage public officials in useful dialogue that moves us toward a comprehensive regional transit plan for our area.

The first step in making this vision a reality is the creation of a regional transit authority that will allow us to capture crucial federal dollars that will otherwise be funneled to other regions. We are urging our legislators to realize the impact and importance of this urgent step.

U.S. cities, such as Denver, Salt Lake City and Portland, have tested and proven transit's impact as an effective economic growth tool, and it has been shown that for every dollar invested in public transportation, communities experience a \$6 to \$8 increase in local economic activity. Regional transportation is worth the investment.

Clearly, the need to reap both the economic and quality-of-life benefits of a world-class mass transit system exists here in Metro Detroit. It is imperative not only that *R-PATH* continues to work together across political and geographic lines to push this common goal forward, but that all state and local leaders lend support on this transformative tool that has the potential to revitalize the region. MARCH MEETING NOTES By Hugh Gurney

The March 17 MARP meeting took place at Pontiac's handsome new transportation center, which serves Amtrak, Greyhound and SMART. After watching Wolverine #353 board about twenty passengers and depart on time for Chicago, we were welcomed by Jim Fetzer, Deputy General Manager of Operations for SMART, which provides the local transit service for Oakland, Macomb and Wayne counties. Fetzer spoke of his part in bringing Amtrak into the Grand Rapids Transportation Center while employed at RAPID. He is looking for ways to better connect SMART with Amtrak in Pontiac, Birmingham-Troy, Royal Oak and Dearborn.

Fetzer expressed pleasure that the Troy Transportation Center will go forward, but noted that many in the Detroit metropolitan area were not enthusiastic about public transportation. In both Wayne and Oakland counties, local communities can opt out of supporting SMART, meaning buses pass through many communities with their doors closed, hurting both the fare box and potential passengers. Despite a 23% cut in service in December, ridership on SMART is up in January and February of this year. Fetzer expressed hope that the proposed Regional Transportation Authority, now under consideration in Lansing, would help public transportation providers in Wayne, Washtenaw, Oakland and Macomb counties coordinate their services better.

Kay Chase noted that TRANS4M would be staging a Transportation Odyssey beginning March 21 to build support statewide for the Regional Transportation Authority. Participants will use local public transportation, Amtrak and Indian Trails to move from Detroit Metro Airport to downtown Detroit, then to Birmingham, Kalamazoo, Grand Rapids, and Traverse City. Events are scheduled in Birmingham, Kalamazoo and Grand Rapids

Both MDOT and Amtrak are supporting New Buffalo's application for a TIGER grant to build a ten mile passing track on the Amtrak line between Dowagiac and Niles and to fund an engineering study on linking CSX tracks with Amtrak just north of New Buffalo, permitting the **Pere Marquette** to serve that station and to gain access to the 110-mph Amtrak route to Porter IN. The Michigan Senate with bipartisan support has approved a resolution supporting the grant application.

MDOT has also approved a Fennville station stop for the *Pere Marquette*. Amtrak must now review this proposal. Langdon will be meeting in the next week with WesTrain about a possible second frequency on the *Pere Marquette. (Continued in next column)*

(March Meeting Notes continued)

Don Monteith continues to advocate for rail access for the newly opening mines along the Michigan/Wisconsin border. Michigan Technical University in Houghton is now considered the best school in the nation for Rail Communication. Employees from CN, NS, CSX, BNSF and other railroads are taking classes there.

Mike Whims reported briefly on Amtrak's petition to the Surface Transportation Board protesting CN's delay of Amtrak trains. John DeLora observed that delays on CN dropped precipitously the day after Amtrak petitioned the STB for relief. Karen Kendrick-Hands suggested that MARP file an *amicus* brief in support of Amtrak's petition. (See last page for more information.)

Slow orders are now in effect on the **Wolverine** route between Chelsea and Kalamazoo until tracks are repaired. Whether the westbound **Blue Water** is held outside Battle Creek when **Wolverine** #351 is late will depend on whether or not the **Blue Water** has enough capacity to handle those boarding at Kalamazoo.

At the afternoon Executive Committee meeting, it was recommended that the chair establish a nominating committee to solicit candidates for the next two year terms of Executive Committee members. The Publications Committee was asked to review the appropriate number of *Michigan Passenger* copies we should be printing. The budget for CY 2012 was finalized. Additional outreach events reaching new audiences were discussed. The Executive Committee accepted the resignation of Treasurer Dave Randall, who is relocating to Texas to be closer to elderly relatives.

CN Responds to Amtrak Complaint

Canadian National responded on March 9 to Amtrak's petition to the Surface Transportation Board protesting CN's delay of Amtrak trains. CN also asked that Amtrak's complaint be held in abeyance until a pending lawsuit by the Association of American Railroads is resolved. In that lawsuit, the AAR sued in U.S. District Court, Washington DC, to block implementation of PRIAA Sec.207 as being unconstitutional. That section ordered the STB and Amtrak, in consultation with other parties, to develop metrics and standards regarding on time performance. The AAR holds that this language turns Amtrak, "a private, forprofit corporation" into a regulatory body, a power which it does not have. CN also contends that Congress never intended that Amtrak have preference on privately owned railroads.

On April 4, the STB granted a motion filed jointly by Amtrak and CN requesting a delay action for 90 days and appointment of a mediator to supervise discussions to resolve the issues.
